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The mixed-use scheme plans submitted to Blaby District Council include a two-storey local centre which will house a Sainsbury's Local store, as well as four additional units marked out for retail, including a café/bistro on the ground floor. Forest House Medical Centre will occupy the first floor, and a 66-bed modern care home is to be built over two and three storeys, which would be delivered by Charterpoint.
